Last month I spent a lot of time planting. As most of you know, my father died around Thanksgiving last year. That resulted in the need to disperse of my parents' belongings and prepare to sell the home I grew up in. That home held so many heartwarming memories. I took some of my favorite plants from my parents' yard to transplant in mine. Finding just the right place in my yard for all the plants I brought home was no small job. I located just the right place for a beautiful dahlia that grew in my parents' front yard. As I put my shovel against the landscape fabric, I was surprised to find something growing underneath. Two years ago, we covered the flower beds with landscape fabric and bark. The first picture shows what had been growing for two years in the dark – calla lily bulbs. They look rather pathetic, don't they? But think of their determination to grow that this represents. For two years they had survived in the dark cramped space under bark and landscape fabric!



The picture makes me think of us. We are urged to stay home. Parents now have the responsibility of teaching and helping their children with schoolwork. What a mammoth task! - Not use any technology owned by CCS to engage in activities for personal profit. This includes accessing of websites that are outside the scope of the curricular activities of CCS.
- Use all communications that follow the established rules for netiquette and I will not participate in conversations, correspondences, or activities via CCS technology that violates them.
