Let's speak out evidence of His goodness to us. There are so many oh so personal ways that I know that God is with me. Let me think about those things. Finally, let us rest in hope. "This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, a hope both sure and steadfast" (Hebrews 6:19a). Let's remind ourselves of this hope that promises not to disappoint.

As we focus our minds and hearts on these truths, our words and actions will reveal these truths to our families and loved ones. And that may be just exactly what we all need in this unprecedented season of life.
