Pick Up and Drop Off

Thanks for all your patience with our pick up and drop off procedures. We continue to tweak the process to make it more efficient. Here are a few tips

Drop Off - When you line up cars in the morning for drop off on the north side of the building, please drive all the way down to the playground equipment before coming back towards the buses. This will help us keep the roads clear of cars waiting to get onto campus. Be assured that if the line jams up and your student has difficulty getting to their classroom before the tardy bell rings, they will not be charged with a tardy.

Pick Up - High school and 7th and 8th grade students will now be dismissed through the front entrance doors unless they have a younger sibling. They can meet their cars outside the fence if that is convenient for you. Please let them know where you will meet them. Hopefully this will shorten our pick-up lines on the north side of the school and expedite pick up.

Paperwork and Forms

If you have any unfinished paperwork ie: Family Information, Wavier of Liability, Emergency Medical or Immunization forms to turn in, we would love to get them all turned in so we can finish out our lists and folders! Thank you!

Absences, Tardies & Early Dismissals

- If a student will be absent, parents are asked to contact the school office by phone or email by 9:00 AM on the day of the absence.
- Students who are absent should expect to receive make-up work upon their return to school. Detailed assignments will not be prepared ahead of the absence.
- If you have **emailed** the school to let us know why the student is going to be absent a note is not necessary upon return. If you have **called**, please send either a **note or email** when your student returns.
- The school office staff will keep the official attendance records. Daily records will be kept for every student in Kindergarten through 10th grade and entered on his or her permanent record at the end of the school year.
- The school administration has the authority to determine whether an absence is excused or unexcused.
- Students who miss 15% or 25 days of the school year will be considered for grade retention.

Students are expected to be at their desk, ready to go, at 8:25 AM. Students who are not ready are considered tardy, *even if they were dropped off before 8:25 AM*. A tardy disrupts the class and students miss valuable time at the beginning of the day.

When a student arrives at the office after the 8:25 AM tardy bell, it is determined if the reason for being late is unavoidable (excused) or avoidable (unexcused). A parent needs to accompany the student into the school and be signed in. The student is then given a tardy slip that they are to give to their teacher.

If a student needs to leave early, please either send a note with the student in the morning or call the office at least a half hour before the student needs to be dismissed.
