Literature

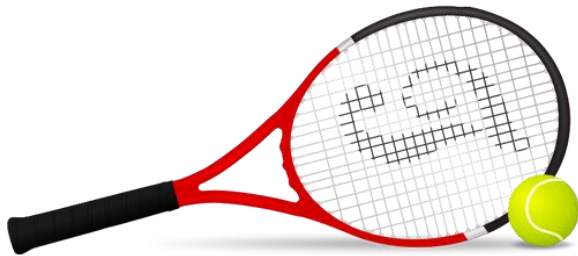

Mathematical Math

This month the Algebra and Algebra 2 classes have been busy studying many different concepts. Let's dive deeper into the students' math classes. In the month of January the Algebra class has been studying linear equations. Linear equations are equations that are able to be graphed on the x-y coordinate plane. The easiest method to use is slope intercept form $y=mx+b$. Algebra 1 uses a song for their linear equations. To help learn the slope formula, here is a song sung to the tune of "O Christmas Tree":

*O Slope you are, O Slope you are, the
Change in Y over Change in X

You're Increasing or Decreasing, You're
Positive or Negative

Algebra 1 also has a math test every Friday and does not receive homework on those days. On the other hand, the Algebra 2 class has been learning many new and exciting things. At the present moment they are studying sine, cosine and tangent. They are also learning about chemical compounds, working hard to stay on track.
